## We're at Work Building to Meet the 10-Year Plan

Housing for New Hope is excited to announce the completion of ten new efficiency apartments for homeless individuals with disabling conditions. Housing for New Hope's new Ann Atwater apartment building, named in honor of the longtime Durham activist and community builder, is a response to the identified and urgent need for permanent, supportive, and affordable housing in Durham.

Since May 2005, Housing for New Hope has offered efficiency units at its Andover Apartments for single persons who are homeless and capable of living independently but who need ongoing access to supportive services for treatment of mental illness or other disabling conditions. The new Ann Atwater building doubles the number of units available at Andover Apartments to twenty.

In the *10-Year Results Plan to End Homelessness in Durham*, recently adopted by the City and County of Durham, there is tremendous emphasis on the development of permanent housing for homeless individuals with disabling conditions. Housing for New Hope played a leadership role in the development of the plan and now is working hard to make sure that the plan's outcomes are met.
