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### Reminder: Who is Counted as Homeless?

- Two groups of people without homes are counted in PIT Counts:
  - 1. People staying in emergency shelter (ES) & transitional housing (TH) dedicated for occupancy by homeless persons, and
  - Unsheltered people "staying in places not ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation."
- The 2023 PIT Count was held on January 25, 2023




## PIT Count by Location, 2016-2023







### **2023 Homeless Count Demographics: Gender**<sup>1</sup>




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### **2023 Homeless Count – Race**



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








## 2023 Homeless Count - Ethnicity





#### Chronically Homeless, Veterans & DV Survivors














## Homeless Children & Youth, 2016-2023<sup>1</sup>

### Who Else and What Else Is Counted?

- The number of formerly homeless people in permanent supportive housing (PSH, HOPWA, HUD-VASH), rapid rehousing projects (RRH), and other perm. hsg. (OPH) dedicated for occupancy by formerly homeless people (EHV) is also counted and reported to HUD, but the people are not counted as homeless on the night of the PIT Count.
- The number of beds of emergency shelter, transitional housing, PSH, RRH, and OPH and the utilization rate of these beds on the night of the PIT Count are reported to HUD.










## Housing Inventory by Hsg. Type, 2016-2023<sup>1</sup>



■ ES ■ TH ■ RRH ■ PSH ■ OPH

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

### Key "Take aways"

- 1. The overall PIT Count decreased over 18%, from 459 in 2022 to 375 people in 2023.
- 2. The unsheltered count continues to increase, up 105% since 2020!
- 3. A 35% decrease of emergency shelter capacity significantly reduced the sheltered count; the unsheltered count increased, but by a much smaller percentage.
- 4. The "total CoC service population" decreased 13%, largely due to reductions in emergency shelter and rapid rehousing capacity.
